Position Description

The Department of Biology invites applications for part-time Academic Instructor to teach one lecture section (3 credits) of Biology 215 (Microbiology) for Human Nutrition in the Department of Biology during the winter term of the 2024-2025 academic year. This lecture section is restricted to students majoring in Human Nutrition or in Human Kinetics with a Nutrition minor.

We seek candidates familiar with the essentials of microbiology from a human health, food and nutrition perspective, including basic immunological concepts, and the roles of viruses, bacteria and fungi. Qualified applicants will have an undergraduate degree in Biology or related field, and a graduate degree, normally a minimum of a Master's degree, and/or a professional degree or designation relevant to the instruction of this course. Preference will be given to individuals who have strong teaching and communication skills.

The successful candidate should employ an equitable, diverse, inclusive, and accessible teaching approach to promote a respectful environment for all students, staff, and faculty.
