Chicago Style 17th Edition (Notes & Bibliography)

- List sources at end of paper on a new page under the heading "Bibliography."
- List sources alphabetically, double-spaced, with a hanging indentation.
- Multiple sources from the same author or group of authors are listed alphabetically based on the title. After first source where authors' names are repeated, replace the authors' names with a long dash (——), which can be created by inserting three em-dashes.
- If an author appears first among several on a source, any single-author entries by the same person are listed above the joint publication, regardless of date.
- If not including a bibliography, long version of footnotes/endnotes must be used for first note and short version for subsequent notes.*
- If including a bibliography, shortened versions of footnotes/endnotes can be used for the first note as well as subsequent notes.**
- Unsigned newspaper articles begin with title in notes, but the title of the newspaper stands in place of the author in the bibliography.***
- Add type of internet source if unclear (e.g., blog, podcast, video), and add access date if no publication date or update date is available.****
